

Title IX Supportive Measures

Title IX provides that “No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.” Upon receiving a report of sexual harassment or sex discrimination, Eastern will take immediate and appropriate action to stop the misconduct, to prevent its recurrence, and to address the effects of the misconduct. Therefore, the College will provide supportive measures as requested and/or appropriate to help remedy the effects upon the parties. Supportive measures are not the same as outcomes or final decisions. Supportive measures are available to both Complainant and Respondent, and parties may be entitled to know which measures have been provided to the other party. Parties should be certain to request any specific supportive measure.

The provision of supportive measures shall be determined on a case-by-case basis by the Title IX Coordinator and/or investigators. Recommended supportive measures shall be implemented by the appropriate College Official or court/law enforcement official.

Possible Supportive Measures:

- Immediate intervention, verbally or physically, to stop the behavior
- Hospital or other qualified medical center/provider for immediate, emergency treatment
- *Complainant cannot be required to pay for a rape kit.*
- Referral for non-emergency medical treatment
- Police Report / Criminal charge(s)
- Court-issued Protective/Peace Order
- College-

Possible Interim Safety Measures (Requires Risk Assessment/Can Be Challenged By The Parties):

Campus / Activity restrictions

Campus suspension

Employment suspension

Prohibited Measures:

Contact between the parties may not be required.

Informal resolution may not be required (but is permitted if the parties agree and if the parties are students/employees)
